The UF in Darmstadt program offers students an opportunity to earn 3 credits studying abroad in Germany. Students will spend fifteen days studying with faculty and students at the Technical University of Darmstadt, Germany.

2012 Undergraduate Program Fee: \$2,515

plus UF local fees of \$16.98 per credit hour paid to UFS

2012 Graduate Program Fee: \$3,442

plus UF local fees of \$34.47 per credit hour paid to UFS

Program fee includes: Tuition for one 3-credit course, prepayment for fourteen nights lodging on the University (TUD) campus in Darmstadt, daily breakfast, ground transportation in Darmstadt, excursions, all entrance fees, cost of instruction and administration, and MedEx emergency insurance.

Cost includes economy-class airfare up to \$1,000 if traveling with the group. Individuals not traveling with the group will be required to arrange and purchase their own airfare.

COURSE OFFERINGS

Courses taught by UF for UF GPA credit:

HLP 4933 – Germany: Hlth&SportSci

HLP 6935 – Germany: Hlth&SportSci (Grad)

All students must participate in all pre-trip and post-trip lectures/discussions, library assignments, field excursions, project and general activities.

Eligibility:

This course is open to all UF students, but especially appropriate for Applied Physiology & Kinesiology or other health related who are in good academic standing. Students must have completed the first semester of their freshman year and have earned a 2.5 GPA on 4.0 scale. A competitive process will be used to select students from those applying.

FEES DUE UPON APPLICATION:

A \$250 nonrefundable deposit toward the total cost of the program is required at the time of application. The remaining fees are due **no later** than 30 days prior to departure.

Students receiving financial aid may defer payment until their financial aid disperses.

Not Included in the program fees:

UF local fees, some meals, course reading packet, additional personal travel and personal expenses.
