**Application Deadline
October 1, 2011**

Eligibility: This course is open to all students, but is especially appropriate for Sport Management and Business students who are in good academic standing (junior or higher).

FEEES DUE UPON APPLICATION:

A \$250 nonrefundable deposit toward the total cost of the program is required at the time of application. The remaining fees are due no later than 30 days prior to departure.

Students receiving financial aid may defer payment until their financial aid disperses.

Not included in the program fees:

2012 Undergraduate Program Fee: \$3,886

plus UF local fees of \$16.98 per credit hour paid to UFS

2012 Graduate Program Fee: \$5,740

plus UF local fees of \$34.47 per credit hour paid to UFS

Program fee includes: Tuition for one 6-credit course, 13 nights' accommodation (5 in Dublin, 8 in England; mix of hotel, guest house/dorm rooms may be used), 11 daily breakfast in-country, entrance fees and tour expenses, transportation and fees for all course excursions, in-country transportation taxes, cost of instruction and administration (including technology expenses), on-site coordinator for the in-country experience, international health insurance and emergency medical assistance.

Round-trip airfare, passport and/or visa fees, personal expenses and some meals not included.

Sport in the British Isles

The course will include both lecture material and a 14 day learning experience in Dublin and London. This course will be taught as a “hybrid” utilizing face-to-face meetings and Sakai (the University of Florida’s online-course offering platform) and has been designed to provide students with a firsthand look at the European model of sport. Students will tour various European (i.e., English and Irish) sport facilities, clubs, venues, and other athletic organizations.

Upon completion of the course students will be able to:

- Describe with rich and diverse history of European sport, with a specific knowledge of the European Model of Club Sports
- Better understand sport in a global community
- Explain the importance and value of sport internationally
- Discuss various popular European sports including, but not limited to, football (soccer), hurling, cricket, rugby, tennis, and Gaelic football
- Witness site preparations for the 2012 Summer Olympic Games

Financial Aid

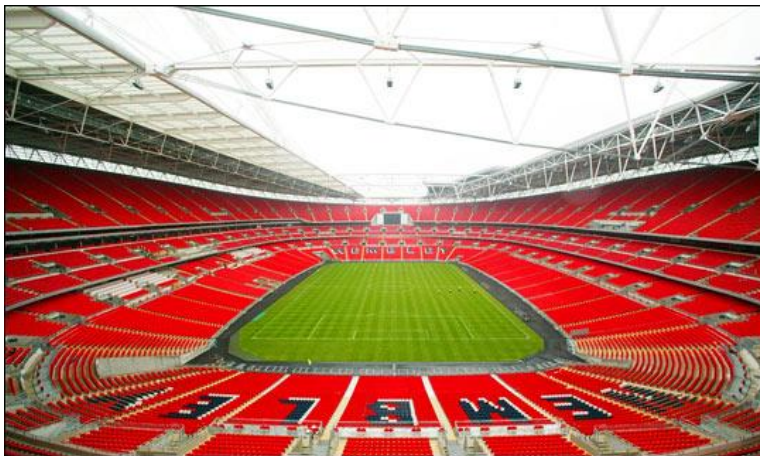
University of Florida students needing financial aid should apply through UF Student Financial Affairs (SFA). Non-UF students needing financial aid must apply to their home institutions.
