2011 Program Fee: \$3,358 – undergraduate credit

Program fee includes: Tuition for one 6-credit course, 11 nights hotel double occupancy, daily breakfast in-country, welcome dinner, farewell dinner, museum entrance fees and tour expenses, transportation and fees for all course excursions, in-country transportation (including airport transfer-Heathrow and Tube pass), gratuities, taxes, cost of instruction and administration (including technology expenses), on-site coordinator for the in-country experience, international health insurance and emergency medical assistance.

Round-trip airfare, passport and/or visa fees, personal expenses and some meals not included.

Athletic Medicine: Discoveries Influencing Clinical Practice

The course will include both lecture material and a 10-12 day learning experience in England. The field experience in London, England and surrounding areas are dedicated to exploration and investigative learning in relevant medical and science museums and university research labs dedicated to evolution of Sports Medicine. The course will cultivate critical thinking and promote a better understanding of how doctors and their discoveries impact modern clinical sports medicine.

Upon completion of the course students will be able to:

1. Identify the scientific discoveries which influence medical advancement and clinical sports medicine practice
2. Analyze and discuss potential future implications of medical discoveries on sports medicine practice
3. Explore historic and present day British culture, while learning firsthand about the foundations of sports medicine through seminars, interactive museum and laboratory tours abroad

Financial Aid

University of Florida students needing financial aid should apply through UF Student Financial Affairs (SFA). Non-UF students needing financial aid must apply to their home institutions.

Assistantships **do not** cover the tuition cost for University of Florida graduate students.



Academic Credits

As this is a UF program, credits taken can satisfy major, elective and/or international/diversity requirements with prior approval.

FEES DUE UPON APPLICATION:

A \$250 nonrefundable deposit toward the total cost of the program is required at the time of application. The remaining fees are due no later than 30 days prior to departure.

Effective Spring 2011 for 2010-11: Students will be charged local fees for UFGPA credit of \$16.22 per undergraduate credit or \$32.05 per graduate credit. These fees will be assessed and paid to UFS in addition to the program fee paid to the International Center.

Students receiving financial aid may defer payment until their financial aid disburses.

Not included in the program fees:
UF local fees, round-trip airfare, some meals, course reading packet, additional personal travel and personal expenses.
