#### HEB Combination Degree Program

- The combination degree in Health Education and Behavior is designed for students seeking an advanced practitioner's degree in Health Education.
- The MS degree prepares health education specialists to work in local, state, and federal health agencies, voluntary health organizations, patient care settings, and private industries.

# HEB Combination Degree Program Criteria

- **1.** Sophomore or Junior status
- 2. Maintain 3.2 UF GPA
- 3. Approval from undergraduate program (must be on-track and in good standing with major)
- 4. Schedule an appointment with Ms. Jenny Neelands (jennifer4@ufl.edu) to complete the BS/MS program application before the end of the first semester during the junior year (semester 5).

Courses must be completed with a B or higher in order to transfer to the HEB MS program.

# **Combination Degree Program Important Facts**

- Students are not penalized for withdrawing from the program.
- Students must apply to the MS program (admission to the MS program after graduation is not automatic).
- Graduate-level tuition is more expensive than undergraduate rates.
- Graduation from your undergraduate program is separate from the MS program.
- The BS/MS program expedites the MS program and saves students (financially) the cost of 4 undergrad courses.

# NOTE:

- The following information pertains to the application process for applying to the HEB MS program.
- <u>The steps outlined in the MS</u> <u>Program application process,</u> <u>detailed on slides #9-#13, are</u> <u>NOT required when applying for</u> <u>the HEB combination degree</u> <u>program.</u>

# **HEB Master of Science Degree**

- Participation in the combination degree program does not automatically ensure admission to the master's program.
- Students must formally submit all required application materials to the department.
- Application for admission to the MS program occurs approximately 6 months before the start of the term in which the student is applying.

# **University of Florida Graduate Admission**

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Two UF units evaluate your application to the UF Graduate School:

- **1**. The department you want to major in, which determines your eligibility for its graduate program.
- 2. UF Office of Admissions, which determines your eligibility for admission to the University of Florida.

# **HEB MS Program Application Materials**

- Completed University of Florida <u>online application</u>
- <u>MS Applicant Information Sheet</u>
- Cover letter / statement of intent describing your areas of professional interest and reasons for pursuing an MS in Health Education degree.
- Resume / Curriculum Vitae
- Three <u>letters of recommendation</u>. At least 2 letters must be from full faculty members who can attest to your academic ability.
- Non-UF students Submission of official transcripts for all previous college coursework to the Office of Admissions and HEB Department.
- Minimum 3.0 GPA for all upper-division undergraduate coursework
- Writing sample strongly encouraged for Thesis Option applicants
- GRE verbal, quantitative, and writing scores are required and will be considered as part of the entire application. Have scores sent to UF (institution code 5812).
- International Students Required minimum score of 80 iBT or 550 PBT on the TOEFL
