### SPM 4154 – Administration in Sport and Physical Activity (3 credits)

**Required Textbook:** Lussier, R. and Kimball, D. (2020). Applied Sport Management Skills. Champaign, Illinois: Human Kinetics. (3<sup>rd</sup> edition only).

**Course Description:** This course provides students with an analysis of sport administration pertaining to various levels of sport organizations. The theoretical underpinnings of the management of sport organizations, concepts of planning, organizational structure, human resource management, and leadership theory will be discussed.

Prerequisites: SPM 2000 and MAN 3025 with minimum grades of C.

Course Objectives: By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Describe the role managers play in the proper functioning of sport organizations.
- Explain the four functions of management in sport organizations.
- Apply management skills to practical sport settings.
- Evaluate current issues facing managers in sport organizations.
- Develop real-word strategies for planning, organizing, leading, and controlling sport organizations.

**Instructional Methods**: The instructional methods for this course consist of asynchronous lectures, readings, and discussions to provide students with a variety of learning methods.

# Assignments (50 x 5 points = 250 points)

- Assignments are designed to assist students in expanding their knowledge and understanding of administrative skills in sport management.
- Specific instructions for completing each assignment will be posted on the Canvas course website under the Module and Assignment pages.
- Late, emailed, or hand-written assignments are not accepted.

# **Discussion Boards**: (7 x 10 points = 70 points)

- Interactions for this course will emerge through online discussions with other students and the professor. Discussion boards will build on weekly readings.
- Students will make two posts for each of the seven discussion boards.
- The seven-discussion boards will involve students posting one response on specified days and times and a second post in response to another student's initial response on specified days and times.
- Only post a second response to another student's initial post that has NOT received a response from another student. This way every student will have at least one response from another student.
- The length of each post should be between 100 to 200 words.

Cover pages are NOT necessary. Include citations, if necessary. Late, emailed, or handwritten assignments are **NOT accepted** unless in accordance with UF's Make-Up Policy.

**6.** Make-Up Policy: There are NO make-ups for missed assignments, discussion boards, quizzes, or exams unless the absence is in accordance with UF's excused absence policy.

**7. Grades:** Grades are dependent on the student's performance measured by, but not limited to, exams, assignments, in-class activities, and attendance. Final grades are based on the accumulation of points the student earns throughout the semester.
