COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will introduce students to research methods commonly practiced in social sciences including qualitative and quantitative methods that are also practiced outside of academia. During the semester we will be covering the research process including research questions and hypotheses, research design, methods, data collection, descriptive data analysis, and presentation.

OBJECTIVES

The primary objectives of this class are to prepare students for research in academia during their studies and working for sport and other organizations in the future. We will do so by:

- 1. Outlining and establishing research questions and hypotheses
- 2. Composing a coherent research framework and structure
- 3. Understanding, reviewing, and summarizing previous studies to establish research questions and methods
- 4. Locating and collecting data from publicly available sources and sources available to students
- 5. Establishing and identifying the benefits and limitations of qualitative and quantitative analysis
- 6. Analyzing descriptive data using different Excel tools such as pivot tables and other functions
- 7. Presenting and articulating research findings in written and oral formats

The last week of class will be dedicated to reviewing the final projects in-class following the presentations delivered the week before. The projects will be done in pairs.
