#### **Course Overview:**

SPM 4104 will provide the student with a basic understanding of the management process as it relates to the use and provision of sport facilities. Topics and discussions will include management theories and strategies, legal implications, financial management, evaluation, and contemporary issues related to the construction and operation of traditional and unique facilities.

Examples will address issues and concepts to be considered from a practitioner's perspective. Guest lecturers from professionals in the field will supplement the lectures and offer insightful perspectives and management strategies.

# **Course Objectives:**

- 1. To understand employee motivational issues.
- 2. To develop a responsibility within the student to support and foster professionalism and professional organizations.
- 3. To encourage students to use all available human, community and natural resources to promote and foster recreation and leisure services.
- 4. To develop a keen awareness of the professional's responsibility to provide opportunities for all populations, settings and services.
- 5. To develop viable programs, facilities and services to serve every lifestyle and/or individual's leisure need throughout the human life span.
- 6. To develop an understanding and knowledge of the principles and procedures necessary to design sport facilities to ensure full participation by all constituents.

- 7. To understand and explain the management process, including concepts of construction and design, organizational behavior, accountability, evaluation, interpersonal relationships and decision making strategies.
- 8. To develop an understanding of all principles and procedures necessary for the operation and maintenance of leisure service resources, areas and facilities.
- 9. To develop communication skills and public relations programs that will enhance the operation of the sport facility.
- 10. To develop a knowledge and understanding of the facility manager's responsibility related to all legal aspects of the facility operation.
- 11. To develop an understanding of risk management systems that will protect visitors, staff and the sport facility.

#### **Discussions:**

Students will take part in seven (6) discussions during the semester. Discussions will take place via Canvas and will focus on either *Class topics or Study items* from the book. Students may be asked to work independently or will be broken up into groups (dependent on the size of the class). Discussions are intended to solicit student comments on specific subject matter whereas they offer personal opinions based upon materials shared in the classroom or/and obtained through social media and subsequent posts shared by students. Additional information and guidelines will be provided. Students will receive four points for each response to the stated question and 3 additional points upon offering a comment on two submittals shared by others students in the class. (10 points total).

#### **Unit Quizzes:**

There will be six (6) quizzes throughout the semester. Quizzes will be available to you via Canvas at any-time during the day on which it is offered; however, you only get one opportunity to complete it. Quizzes are open notes. We are not responsible for computer or connection errors, so please

make sure you use a reliable computer with a secure connection. I recommend taking quizzes earlier in the day to leave you more time in case there is an issue. Should you have a computer complication, be sure to contact Learning Support Services and email me immediately with your LSS Request #. Students will receive 5 points for each correct response on the 2 question quiz for each of the six quizzes. (10 points total).

## **Video Reviews:**

Upon reviewing specific videos, you are asked to prepare and denote five (5) bullet points summarizing the video. Each bullet point is worth 2 points. Please submit this review on Canvas by the stated deadline and be sure to highlight specific items you learned from the videos.

#### Written Exam:

The written exam will be developed from the textbook readings, class assignments and lecture/module material. Students are expected to take the exam as scheduled. Exceptions will be made only for documented illnesses and official university activities. Failure to complete the exam prior to the listed due date will result in a score of 0 (zero) for that exam.
