THEM UNDERGRADUATE GUIDE DUAL DEGREE

Eligibility - For a student to be considered for a dual degree, the following criteria must be met accordingly:

- Have demonstrated a well-articulated educational goal for which the dual degree is appropriate and/or necessary.
- Have between 45 and 96 hours (excluding AP, IB, dual enrollment, or overseas study credit).
- Have at least a 3.0 UF GPA at the time the application is submitted.
- Meet all universal tracking requirements for the major requested.
- Meet all other college progression standards for both majors and demonstrate potential for success in both majors.
- Be able to complete the degree within the appropriate time frame listed below:
 - For students admitted as freshman to UF: 140 hours or 8 semesters (not including summers) without exceeding the maximum credit hours per semester. (Excludes AP/IB and Dual Enrollment courses)
 - For students admitted as transfer to UF: 70 hours or 4 semesters (not including summers) without exceeding the maximum credit hours per semester. (Excludes AP/IB and Dual Enrollment courses not needed for HHP program)

How to Apply for a Dual Degree with THEM:

Students who meet the above guidelines may apply by completing the appropriate application:

- 1. Meet with an advisor in both departments to review eligibility.
- 2. Create a semester by semester schedule for completing coursework.
- 3. Complete all tracking requirements for both degrees.
- 4. Submit a Dual Degree Application

Requesting Additional Semesters: Students who need more than 8 semesters to complete both degrees must complete the HHP General Petition Form and submit it with a graduation plan to your academic advisor. For your request to be considered, you must meet the following criteria:

- Have minimum 2.0 UF GPA
- Have the minimum universal tracking GPA as designated by department curriculum
- Have the minimum upper division GPA as designated by department curriculum
- Have the minimum major GPA as designated by department curriculum
